INTRODUCTION: Elijah was born in a difficult time in Israel.

1 Kings 16:30-31 – Why is Jezebel mentioned?

- 1 She Was The Dominant Partner In The Marriage.
- 2 She Brought Baal Worship Into Prominence.
 - Baal was the god of rain and fertility.

<u>16:32-33</u> – This was a time of prominent Baal worship.

- **17:1** Elijah = "*My God Is Jehovah*".
 - Elijah was an "in your face" kind of Prophet.
 - Baal was the god of rain, crops, fertility <u>James 5:17</u>
- 17:2-3 God tells Elijah to "hide".
 - God wants to train him for his mission and ministry 17:24
- <u>17:4</u> God tells Elijah how He will provide for him.
- 17:5 Elijah plans on staying for the "long haul".
- 17:6 God never failed him.
- <u>17:7</u> Elijah is in God's will ... so ... <u>WHY</u>?
 - Has your "brook ever dried up"?
 - Sometimes it seems like God has left and forgotten us.
 - The God who provides water, can also withhold water!
 - Do we want what's "fair", or God's grace and mercy?
 - God can do whatever He wants ... He's SOVEREIGN!
 - God always has your best interests in His mind.
 - God always knows what He's doing.
 - When your "brook dries up", God is <u>FOCUSING</u> on you Romans 8:28
- 17:8-9 Elijah was getting too "comfortable".
 - Sometimes God has to get our FOCUS back on Him.
 - God is leading Elijah on to greater things.
