## "Doubting Thomas"

- **INTRODUCTION:** Much happened in the 40 days between the Resurrection and the Ascension of Jesus.
- Thomas is known for his "doubting" but not for his "faith".
- <u>John 11:8,16</u> We see Thomas' <u>LOYALTY</u> to Jesus. <u>John 14:3-5</u> – Again, we see Thomas' <u>FAITH</u> and <u>LOYALTY</u>.
- <u>John 20:19,24</u> Jesus appears before the 10 Disciples, without Thomas being present.
  - Many had their doubts about Jesus' resurrection Luke 24:9-12
- **20:19b-20** Jesus offers the troubled Disciples "peace".
- 20:21 Jesus has a MINISTRY for them, to tell the "Good News".
- **20:22** They are now indwelt by the Holy Spirit ... Born Again.
- <u>20:23</u> Their message will bring others to salvation in Christ Romans 10:14-15 ... this is OUR MESSAGE!
- **20:24** Thomas missed out ... everybody's EXCITED!
- 20:25 This is what Thomas is usually remembered for.
  - Thomas wanted a personal experience with the resurrected Jesus, like the other Disciples had ... Thomas wasn't CONTENT!
  - Thomas didn't want to be "left out".
  - Maybe he remembered what Jesus had said Matthew 24:23-26
- 20:26 They were supposed to be witnessing 20:21
  - Jesus offers Thomas the same "peace" He'd given the other 10.
  - Jesus will reveal Himself to the earnest seeker Jeremiah 29:13
- **20:27** It never says that Thomas ever did this to believe.
- <u>20:28</u> A very profound statement! Total commitment!
- 20:29 Here, Jesus has a message about YOU!
  - Though we haven't "seen" Him, the Holy Spirit opens our blinded eyes to the truth of the risen Lord.

## **CONCLUSION:**

- Mark 9:24 "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief."
- Like Thomas, we need to have a hunger for all that Jesus has for us.
