# "Second Chance – OR – Last Chance?" Jonah 3:1-10

### <u>INTRODUCTION</u>: "Go! ... No!" ... Whoa!" - 2:10

- 3:1 "second time" Failure doesn't have to be permanent.
  - A fresh command gives Jonah a fresh beginning.
- 3:2 God's message doesn't change 1:2a
  - "Arise" Your "Nineveh" is outside this church.
  - "go" Don't just invite them to come where you are.
- 3:3 See 1:3a

#### 1.- JONAH REPENTED

- The last step in repentance is <u>OBEDIENCE</u> <u>2 Peter 2:22</u>
- 3:3b Nineveh was a "great city", full of great sin.
- 3:4 Jonah was preaching condemnation, not for conversions.
- Why "forty days"? A time of testing, then judgment.

### 2.- NINEVEH REPENTED - 3:5

- God took the initiative -2:9b "Salvation is of the LORD."
- This was a "God-thing" ... God prepared their hearts.
- "Before you talk to someone about God ... talk to God about the someone."
- "sackcloth" They SHOWED their misery over their sin.
  - Are we too "comfortable" in our sin today?
- 3:6 God touched the King's heart, as well.
- 3:7 Condemnation isn't mentioned ... only their repentance.
- What happens when sin is exposed today? Matthew 12:41

#### **EVIDENCES OF REPENTANCE:**

- 1.- 3:7b A Change Of Appetite ... A Cessation Of Sin
- 2.- 3:8 A Change Of Action ... A Confession Of Sin Mt. 3:8
- **3.-** <u>3:9</u> A Change Of Attitude ... A Conviction Of Sin <u>2 Corinthians 7:10</u>
- 3:9 The King knows they didn't deserve God's forgiveness.

## 3.- **GOD REPENTED** - 3:10 - Malachi 3:6

- God's proclamation of condemnation was conditional –  $\underline{1:2}$ 

#### **CONCLUSION**: "forty days"

- <u>SALVATION</u> and <u>RESTORATION</u> are a "limited time offer" - <u>Revelation 3:20</u>, <u>Hebrews 2:3</u>

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
