## <u>JONAH</u> – "The Pouting Prophet" – 4:3-11

## <u>INTRODUCTION</u>: <u>Jonah 3:4</u>, <u>3:10</u>, <u>4:1</u>

- 4:3 Nineveh's repentance wasn't because of Jonah 2:9
  - Jonah doesn't want to die, but wants Nineveh to die.
  - Jonah has his **PRIORITIES** all wrong.
- 4:4 God is GRACIOUS to Jonah Luke 15:10
  - We tend to justify our anger James 1:19-20
  - "Speak when you are angry, and you will make the best speech you'll ever regret."
- <u>4:5</u> Jonah hopes Nineveh's repentance isn't sincere.
  - You don't have to love someone to give them God's Word.
  - Jonah is more interested in his comfort than in lost souls.
  - Some Christians only want those in Church who are just like them
  - Jonah was willing to serve God as long as God was going to do what Jonah wanted God to do.
- 4:6 "prepared" see 1:17
  - Just because life is good, doesn't mean you're in God's will.
  - Jonah's "pet plant" makes him happy for the first time.
- <u>4:7-8</u> God doesn't want to leave us in our wayward condition for too long, or we'll get to <u>COMFORTABLE</u> outside God's will.
  - Jonah should have had Job's attitude <u>Job 1:21</u>
- **4:9-10** Same question as in **4:4**.
  - You don't have to love the lost, because, God loves them ... He just tells us to go to them with the Gospel.
  - Loving anything more than God, or loving something God doesn't love, is IDOLATRY.
- $\underline{4:11}$  God is more interested in souls  $\underline{1}$  Timothy 1:15
- 1 What ever happened to JONAH?
- 2 What ever happened to NINEVEH?

## **CONCLUSION:**

- Do you see some of Jonah in you? Self-centered ... don't want to share God's love ... fail to see God's love for the lost ... majoring on the minor ... not on same page with God.
